Our Strengths

- 1. Our school is well-established with a long history and good traditions.
- 2. The lush campus containing plentiful plants provides a peaceful environment in which students can cultivate an appreciation of nature's beauty.
- 3. Our school has established a good tradition in developing students' multi-intelligence and cultivating among students six virtues through a great variety of co-curricular activities.
- 4. With all students staying inside the school premises during the school hours, there is more time for school life and teacher-student interaction.
- 5. Our school possesses a large, professional teaching force, keeping abreast of continual professional development. Many of our teachers are highly experienced and capable.
- 6. We provide broad curriculum and assessment methods that cater for students' diverse learning interests and styles. Substantial amount of resources are allocated to students of low ability.
- 7. Both students and parents are impressed by teachers' knowledge and attitude.
- 8. Good teacher-student relationships and good parent-school relationships.

Our Weaknesses

- 1. Students are diverse in learning abilities, motivations and socio-economic backgrounds.
- 2. Students' learning motivation & attitude, courtesy, self-discipline, self-confidence and self-expectation need to be enhanced.
- 3. Classroom management, assignment collection, continuous assessments have become challenging tasks in recent years.
- 4. Collaboration and cooperation among teaching staff, positive support to alleviate excessive workloads and to maintain teacher morale and job satisfaction need to be further cultivated.
- 5. Further improvement in teaching and learning can be made to cater for the increasingly diverse needs of students and the shift in focus in recent and forthcoming curriculum reform.

Our Opportunities

- 1. The considerable number of new teachers and young teachers may provide the school with new and positive pedagogical experiences.
- 2. Admission of newly arrived mainland immigrants can be a positive stimulus to our students in regard to learning attitudes and social interaction.
- 3. Recent threat of class cut in S.6 has made student realize the importance of their academic learning and achievements.
- 4. Parents are supportive to school's culture, policies and development directions.

- 5. A resourceful school homepage will be a good external communication channel and source of information for increasing public access and enquiries.
- 6. The new curriculum reform (NSS) enhances teacher professionalism. With a large teaching force, our school can offer more elective subjects to our students.
- 7. To prepare for the NSS, teachers will be given more opportunities to work collaboratively and learn new pedagogies. This helps to promote their cooperation and cohesion as well as competency in handling student problems.
- 8. Our Visual Arts teachers obtaining the "Chief Executive's Award for Teaching Excellence (2006-2007)" demonstrated to the public the advantages and strengths of our teaching in Visual Arts subject.
- 9. The school is anticipating its Golden Jubilee (50th Anniversary) in 2008-2009. Enthusiasm of students and teachers, as well as OSA will be aroused, giving renewed impetus to pursue improvement.
- 10. External School Review is an opportunity to accelerate school improvement.

Our Threats/Our Challenges

- 1. Reduction of number of students in the territory and severe competition for the recruitment of new students amongst secondary schools in the community make it more demanding for the school to improve its effectiveness.
- 2. Under the present student allocation system, we will accept students of greater learning diversity, some of whom are of low standard and weak foundation. It is a great challenge to our teaching and learning.
- 3. Imbalanced sex structure (more boys than girls) in S1 intake requires our careful planning on the allocation of resources and teaching strategies.
- 4. Teachers' increasing workload affects the quality and quantity of interaction time with students.
- 5. Increasingly complicated and alienated family relationship affects family support to students' learning and parent-school communication.
- 6. Wave of individualism and impact of youth subculture affect students' learning motivation & attitude, moral judgment, and inter-personal skills
